Unlike apparently similar culturally responsive approaches to teaching underprivileged children, radical-local teaching explicitly uses subject matter teaching to encourage children's development in relation to their social conditions. Hedegaard and Chaiklin detail how they developed concrete lesson plans in a radical-local perspective, and enumerate the accomplishments as well as the difficulties they encountered in implementing this approach.

His wife was called for Interview in Ministry of Foreign Affairs (Ausländerbehörde) in Germany and he was called in German Embassy , Islamabad , at the same time. It took about a year for verifications of documents. An authorized man from embassy had also done verifications of documents and interview of applicant at home and his job place.
